Membership:

Unit elections in all eligible units by: April 10th 20 points
 By Spring Ordeal 10 points By Fall Ordeal 5 points

Brotherhood conversion, percent of eligible Ordeal members:

1 – 15%	5 points	16 – 20%	10 points
21 – 30%	20 points	31 – 40%	25 points
41 – 50%	30 points		

Administration:

Chapter submits an article for the Thunderhead: 5 points per article

Chapter make a list of troop OA representatives, by April 1 5 points

Chapter makes and uses a phone tree, by April 1 5 points

Inductions:

Chapter furnishes one elangomat per 8 chapter candidates: 5 points
 Bonus for furnishing 1 per 4 candidates: 10 points

Has a ceremony team that serves the lodge or a scout unit: 5 points per ceremony, 25 points max

Bonus Points:

Hold Chapter Elangomat Training:	5 points
Dance/Sing Team:	5 points
Active Ordeal or Brotherhood team:	5 points

Service:

Serve as host chapter for a Lodge Event: 5 points

Complete a community/One Day service project: 5 points/project, 20 points max

Visit units to promote camp or camping: 5 points

Assist staffing/program at District Events: 5 points/event, 10 points max

Participation:

Chapter Provides addition youth arrowmen for Ordeal: 5 points
 (excludes elangomats)

Chapter Represented by an officer at LEC 5 points/LEC

Chapter represented at LLDC 10 points

Chapter represented at Fellowships & Conclave 5 points per event

QUALITY CHAPTERS WILL ACHIEVE 125 POINTS
 Recognition will be awarded at the annual Lodge Banquet.

For points to be awarded, the chapter must complete the requirement to the extent that is reasonable and possible. There is some flexibility, but should be done in consultation with the Chapter Adviser, who in turn may consult with the Lodge Adviser and Lodge Chief. For example, representation at LEC meetings “by an officer” means an officer or his predetermined delegate, but not just whoever shows up at the event. Completing a task, such as unit elections is dependant on response by units, so if a unit is not in a position to cooperate, that shouldn’t count against the chapter, as long as the chapter makes every reasonable effort. Also, we would not “count off” in evaluating the troop OA rep list for troops that don’t have reps. The important thing is that the chapter makes contact.

Completion of each category and points assignment will be signed off by the Chapter Chief and turned in to the Lodge Chief by November 1. Keep your scorecard with you, and record your points when they occur, such
